DANIEL CHAPIN served in Capt. David Beebe's company, in Col. Roger Enos' regiment of Connecticut State troops, on the Hudson, in 1778, for three months.

DARIUS CHAPIN enlisted Sept. 19, 1777, in Capt. Sylvanus Willcox's company, Col. John Ashley's Berkshire County regiment. Served in the Northern army; discharged Oct. 19, 1777. Was in Capt. Adam Kasson's company, Col. John Ashley's Berkshire County regiment, ordered out by General Fellows, Oct. 14, 1780.

DAVID CHAPIN enlisted March 1, 1778, at Hartford, for three years, in Capt. Joseph Walker's company, in Col. Samuel B. Webb's regiment, which went into camp at Peekskill in the spring of 1777, and served in Parsons' brigade under General Putnam during movements of following summer and fall. On loss of Forts Clinton and Montgomery, October, 1777, it crossed to west side of Hudson and served under Governor Clinton of New York, for a time. On December 10, the regiment engaged with other troops in an expedition against Long Island. Present at battle of Springfield, N. J., June 23, 1780, and during following summer served with main army on the Hudson; discharged Feb. 19, 1781. He was a
